And whereas an instrument in writing having been filed in the town clerk's office in said town purporting to be the decision and determination of said commissioners duly made and signed by them at the hearing held on the 5th day of February A.D. 1870 wherein they decided and determined that the orders determination of the supervisors in refusing to lay out the said highway be and in all respects reversed.

Now therefor pursuant to law we the undersigned supervisors of said town did on the 14th day of February A.D. 1870 make out a notice and fix therein a time and

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place at which we would meet again for the purpose of laying out the said highway and did meet on the 8th day of March A.D. 1870 at ten o'clock A.M. on said day at the ticket office on the Germantown railway depot in said town it being the time and place fixed by us in said notice, and having first been satisfied that the aforesaid notice had been duly given five days previous to the time of our said meeting to all the occupants of the land through which said highway passes and had also been posted up in three public places in said town ten days before the time of our said meeting in the manner required by law.
